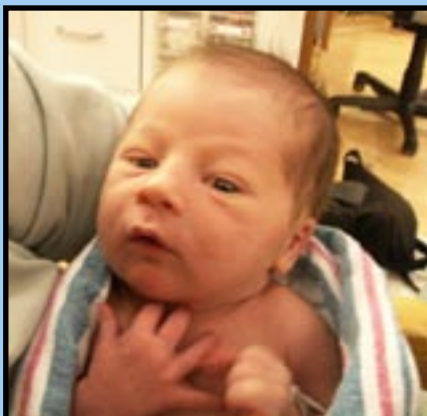
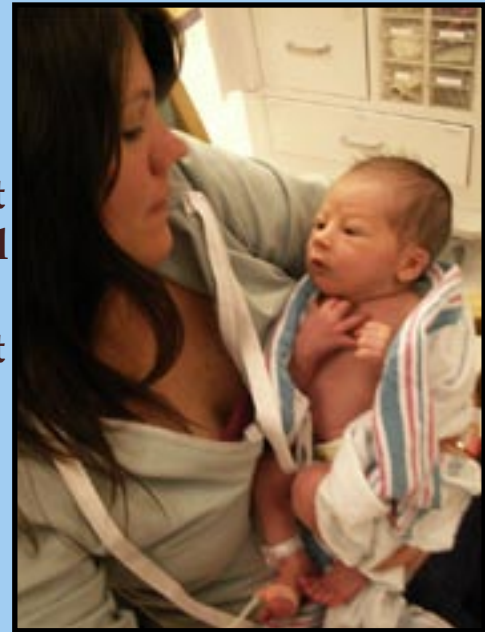
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Well, it was one of the happiest, but longest weeks of my life!

Look at the difference in the photos on this page and then next. They change so fast!!!!

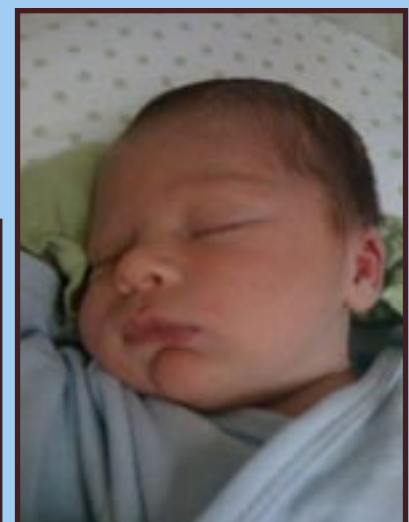


They have had lots of company already and even had friends in for the Super Bowl. Nothing seems to bother him. Just an angel!
