

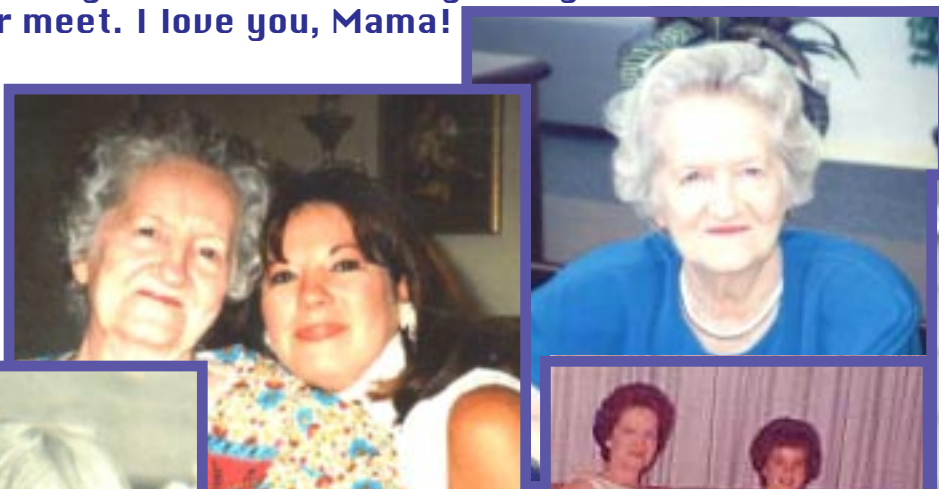
# FRIDAY FOLLIES

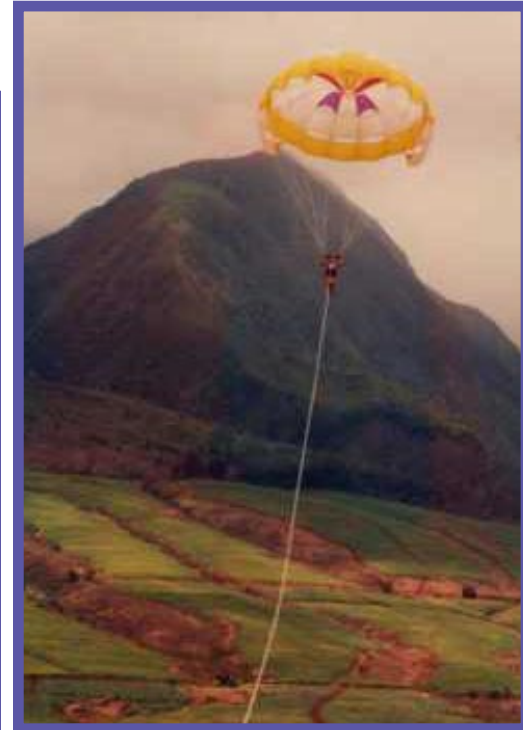
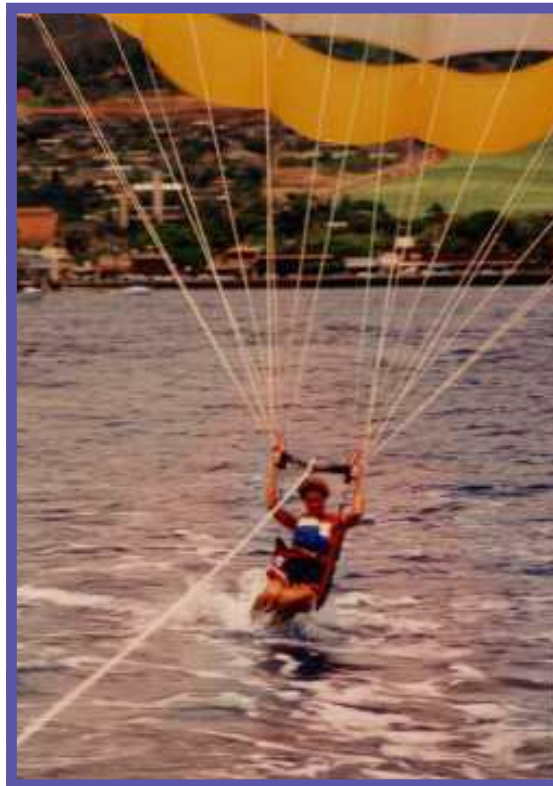
