Hey!

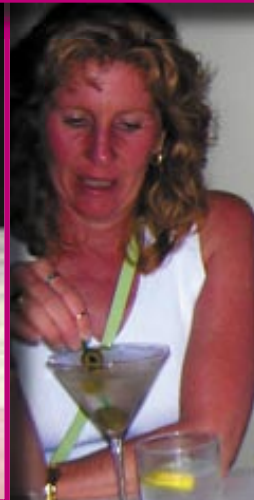

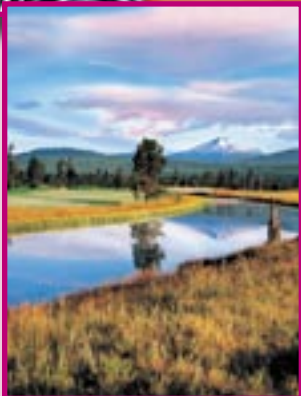

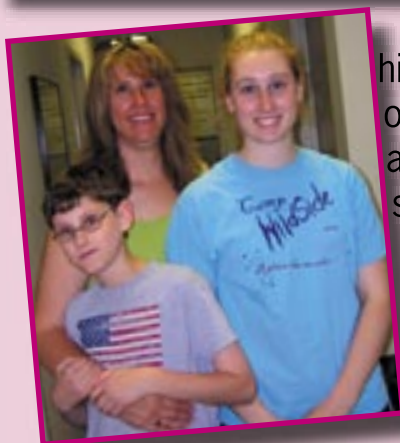
