better. At this junction, the report has been denied. The superintendent is gathering  
his Administrative Council this afternoon, and then updating the whole ASK staff at  
3:00 p.m. We do have international reporters in the city staying at one of our nice  
hotels since the marine shooting earlier in the week on one of our small islands off of  
Kuwait. Therefore, things went amuck with information flying. Currently, I do not  
feel anxious or nervous for my safety, but cautious to see what develops. I would  
really hate to leave, as I have just gotten my oceanfront apartment feeling like a  
"home." Also, the school is rocking & rolling with all sorts of good stuff!  
Thanks for caring, Judi, I will keep you posted.*




Here is a wonderful, fun, Fall Recipe I found and tried this weekend. We LOVED it and will make it a fall tradition at our house! Easy too. Try it. I think you will like it.

### Smoked Sausage Oktoberfest

- 1 (1 lb.) package Smoked Sausage, any variety, cut into 6 pieces
- 4 to 6 medium potatoes, peeled, if desired, cut into 1-inch pieces
- 2 (14 to 16 Oz.) cans sauerkraut, drained
- 1 medium onion cut into wedges
- 1 cup apple cider or apple juice
- 1/4 teaspoon ground pepper
- 2 medium red and/or green cooking apples, cored, cut into 1/4 inch slices

Coat a 4-quart Dutch oven with nonstick cooking spray. Add the sausage. Cook over medium heat for 5 minutes turning to brown evenly. Add potatoes, sauerkraut and onion. Pour apple cider over potato mixture. Sprinkle with pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 20 minutes. Add apple slices. Cover and simmer for 3 to 5 minutes or until potatoes and apple slices are tender. Season to taste with salt and pepper.
